NATIONAL EDUCATION POLICY (NEP) 2020.

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
1. PREAMBLE

The government of India has notified National Education Policy (NEP) 2020 and the objective is to have holistic and multidisciplinary under-graduate education to produce employable graduates with integrated personality. University Grants Commission (UGC) through its letter no. 1-1/2021(QIP) (CBCS) dated 12/12/2022 notified the Curriculum and credit framework for Undergraduate programs.

The Sri Guru Granth Sahib World University (SGGSWU) in sync with the curriculum and credit framework for undergraduate programmes recommended by UGC has designed a Curriculum Framework for Undergraduate Programmes in semester mode under various disciplines from the Academic Session 2023-24. The thrust of NEP under Choice based Credit System (CBCS) is on continuous learning and evaluation, interdisciplinary study and accumulation of course credits. It aims at making the academic programs student oriented, flexible, interdisciplinary and relevant in the current era. The students will have freedom to choose subjects that suit their interest, aptitude and needs. The students shall be provided ample opportunities during the programme of the study to accumulate credits by opting for Major Courses (MJ), Minor Courses (MI), Multidisciplinary Courses (MD), Ability Enhancement Courses (AE), Skill Enhancement Courses (SE), and Value Added Courses (VA) under various disciplines. Students can choose major, minor, multidisciplinary and other courses at the time of their admission and during the course of the study. This system aims to strengthen the academic potential of the students. It provides flexibility in the choice of courses offered beyond the framework of the respective disciplines of study.

The following four years under graduate programmes structures have been designed in the disciplines: Science, Social Sciences, Languages, Performing Arts, Commerce, Management and Computer Applications.

- a) **Bachelor of Science (B.Sc.) (Chemistry Honours), B.Sc. (Physics Honours), B.Sc. (Mathematics Honours), B.Sc. (Medical), B.Sc. (Non-medical), B.Sc. (Medical Lab Technology)**
- b) **Bachelor of Arts (B.A.), B.A. (Economics Honours), B.A. (English Honours), B.A. (Social Sciences), B.A. (Gurmukhi Education)**
- c) **Bachelor of Commerce (B.Com.)**
- d) **Bachelor of Management (BBA), BMS (Gurdwara Management)**
- e) **Bachelor of Computer Applications (BCA)**

f) **Bachelor of Physical Education and Sports Science (B.P.E.S.)**

The Students will have the option to exit after one year with a certificate, two years with award of the diploma and after three years with the award of the bachelor degree. Successful completion of the four years programme will lead to award of the bachelor degree (honours/research) in a particular subject. Continuation of the undergraduate programmes for the fourth year is optional.

(ii) The present post-graduate programmes in subjects will be restructured into one-year master's degree programmes for honours/research degree holders and two years master's degree programmes for the three years bachelor's degree holders.


2. TITLE

These regulations shall be called "Statutes Governing Four Years Undergraduate Programmes (FYUGP)" with Multiple Entry and Exit options in the Faculties of Sri Guru Granth Sahib Studies, Basic and Applied Sciences, Commerce and Management, Languages, Engineering (BCA), Social Sciences, Education and Information Science (BA) under National Education Policy (NEP) 2020 for the Sri Guru Granth Sahib World University with effect from the academic year 2023-24.

3. SCOPE AND APPLICATIONS

a. The undergraduate academic programmes governed by these statutes shall be of 4 years duration (Annexure—1) with multiple entry and exit options with appropriate Certifications/Diplomas/Degrees namely,

i. **Bachelor's Certificate** in a Discipline upon the successful completion of the First



Year (Two Semesters).

ii. **Bachelor's Diploma** in a Discipline upon the successful completion of the Second Year (Four Semesters).

iii. **Bachelor's Degree** in a Discipline at the successful completion of the Third Year (Six Semesters).

iv. **Bachelor's Degree (Honours/Research)** in a Discipline till the successful completion of the Four years (Eight Semesters).

b. Eligibility, qualifications, admission procedure and fee structure for each programme of study shall be approved by the Academic Council of the university.

c. The students who exit with certification, diploma and three years bachelor degree- shall be eligible to re-enter in the programme to complete the next levels.

d. Major subject in a discipline is an area in which student graduates for 3 years bachelor degree or 4 years bachelor degree with honours/research. A student has to opt minor course other than major available in the university in any discipline. However, student/s can swap between minor and major at the start of 1st semester only if vacancy/s seats are available after following procedure laid down for the purpose.

e. These regulations shall apply to all under graduate programs offered by the university with effect from academic year 2023-24.

f. These regulations shall not apply to undergraduate programmes like BA-BEd (Integrated), BA-LLB (Integrated), B.Tech., BSc (Agriculture), BPT of the university.

4. DEFINITIONS

a) **MAJOR COURSE (MJ):** A major course as discipline specific core course is the field in which a student focuses during the course of his/her degree.


b) **MINOR COURSE (MI):** A minor course can be opted with in the broad framework of the Programme.

c) **MULTIDISCIPLINARY COURSES FROM OTHER DISCIPLINES (FOUNDATION COURSES) (MD):** A multi- disciplinary course is an option to explore disciplines of interest beyond the choices students make in major courses.

d) **ABILITY ENHANCEMENT COURSES (AE):** These are generic skill courses aimed to enhance skills in communication, language, mathematical ability.

e) **SKILL ENHANCEMENT COURSES (SE):** Skill enhancement courses are aimed to promote skills. The purpose of these courses is to provide students skills in hands so as to increase their employability/self- employment.

f) **VALUE ADDED COURSES (VA):** Value added interdisciplinary courses are to



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enhance the standard of the students beyond specified academic curriculum.

g) **SUMMER INTERNSHIP:** Summer internship is a programme to develop professional ability through an appropriate training.

ability through an appropriate training.

h) RESEARCH PROJECT/DISSERTATION: Project work is a course involving application of knowledge in solving/ analysing/ exploring a real life problem.

i) **CHOICE BASED CREDIT SYSTEM (CBCS):** It is a flexible system of learning focuses on student centric education and permits students to choose course from a wide range of courses, adopt an interdisciplinary approach in learning, make best use of the expertise of available faculty.

j) **PROGRAMME:** 'Programme' weans a course of study and examination leading to the award of a certificate/diploma/degree in a subject.

k) **COURSE:** "Course" refers to a paper having specified credits which is a component of a programme in a subject. The courses define the learning objectives and learning outcomes. A course may be designed to comprise lectures/tutorials/laboratory work/field work/outreach activities/project work/dissertation work/summer internship/vocational training etc. or a combination of some of these.

I) **ACADEMIC WEEK:** "Academic Week" is a unit of five working days during which distribution of work is organized as six to eight contact hours on each day. Each semester shall consist of at least

shall consist of at least 15 weeks of study with 90 working days (excluding the time spent for the conduct of final examination of each semester).

m) **CREDIT:** Credit is the weightage given to each course of study. It is the numerical value assigned to a course according to the relative importance or the contents and the contact hours required to teach the prescribed syllabi of the programme. The definition of credit in hours is as prescribed by UGC.

The instructional days as worked out by the UGC for one academic year are 180 days i.e. 90 days per semester.

Mechanism for Computation of Work-load:

The following mechanism shall be adopted for computation of work-load:

- 1 Credit = 1 Theory period of one-hour duration/week/semester;
- 1 Credit = 1 Tutorial period of one-hour duration/week/semester;
- 1 Credit = 1 Practical period of two hours' duration/week/semester;
- 1 Credit = Internship of 1 week/semester.

n) **DISCIPLINE:** This refers to faculty *namely* Basic and Applied Sciences, Commerce and

Management, Languages, Engineering (BCA), Social Sciences, Education and Information Science (B.A. (Gurmukhi Education), B.P.E.S.)

o) **"UNIVERSITY"**: means the Sri Guru Granth Sahib World University, Fatehgarh Sahib.


p) **DURATION OF THE PROGRAMME**: The undergraduate degree should be of either a three year or four-year duration, with multiple entry and exit options within this period. The four years bachelor's programme is the preferred option as it allows the opportunity to experience the full range of holistic and multidisciplinary education with a focus on major and minor subjects as per the student's preference. The undergraduate programmes shall extend over four academic years (eight semester). The students can exit after the completion one academic year (two semesters) with certificate; diploma after the study of two academic years (four semesters) and regular bachelor degree after the completion of three academic years (six semesters). A candidate who successfully completes a three-year bachelor's degree with minimum CGPA of 6.0 and wishes to pursue the fourth year of the undergraduate programme shall be allowed to continue the programme to obtain the bachelor's degree with honours/research.

q) **ACADEMIC BANK OF CREDIT (ABC)**: The Academic Bank of Credit, a national-level facility, which promote the flexibility of the curriculum framework and interdisciplinary/multidisciplinary academic mobility of students across the higher education institutions (HEIs) in the country with an appropriate "credit transfer" mechanism. It is a mechanism to facilitate the students to choose their own learning path to attain a degree/diploma/certificate, working on the principle of multiple entry and exit as well as anytime, anywhere, and any level of learning. ABC will enable the integration of multiple disciplines of higher learning leading to the desired learning outcomes including increased creativity, innovation, higher-order thinking skills and critical analysis. ABC will provide significant autonomy to the students by providing an extensive choice of courses for a programme of study, flexibility in curriculum. Novel and engaging course options across a number of higher education disciplines/ institutions.

Provided also that payment made in shape of fee paid by a student (which is refundable in case admission or re-admission is refused) does not automatically confirm the right of admission or continuation as a student in the university.

5. MEDIUM OF INSTRUCTIONS AND EXAMINATION

English and Punjabi shall be the medium of examination in all the courses except in courses where the medium of instruction and examination shall be the specified separately.

6. ACADEMIC BANK ACCOUNT

The multiple entries and exit options for students are facilitated at the undergraduate levels. It would facilitate credit accumulation through the facility created by the ABC scheme in the "Academic Bank Account" opened for the students across the country to transfer and consolidate their credits by undergoing courses in any eligible HEIs. The ABC allows for credit redemption by commuting the accrued credits in the Academic Bank Account maintained in the ABC to fulfil the credits requirements for awarding certificate/diploma/degree by the authorised HEIs. Upon collecting a certificate, diploma, degree, all the credits earned till then, in respect of that Certificate or degree shall be debited and deleted from the account concerned. HEIs offering programmes with multiple entries and exit systems need to register in the ABC to enable acceptance of multidisciplinary courses, credit transfer, and credit acceptance. The validity of credits earned will be for a maximum period of seven year's or as specified by the Academic Bank of Credit (ABC). The procedure for depositing credits carried, its shelf life, the redemption of credits would be as per UGC (Establishment and Operationalization of Academic Bank of Credit (ABC) scheme in Higher Education) Regulations, 2021.

7. CONDITIONS FOR TRANSFER OF ADMISSION OF STUDENTS:


A candidate migrating from any other University may be permitted to join odd semester of the degree programme provided he/she has passed all the subjects of previous semesters. Such candidates must satisfy all other conditions of eligibility stipulated in the regulations of the university.

For students, migrating from other universities/college, the marks/grades obtained/credits earned in under graduate programmes as per NEP 2020 examinations conducted by another university from which the candidate has migrated shall be taken into account for determining the final result of the Sri Guru Granth Sahib University. The admission procedure, eligibility, fee and other norms shall apply to such candidates migrating in the university.

8. FOUR-YEARS UNDER GRADUATE PROGRAMMES STRUCTURE REGULATIONS

(i) **UG Degree Programmes with Single Major:** A student has to secure a minimum of 50% credits from the major discipline for the 3-year/4-year UG degree to be awarded a single major. The university shall offer the following programmes as honours/major course options:

- a) B.Sc. Chemistry Honours (4 years) or B.Sc. Major in Chemistry (3 years)



- b) B.Sc. Physics Honours (4 years) or B.Sc. Major in Physics (3 years)
- c) B.Sc. Mathematics Honours (4 years) or B.Sc. Major in Mathematics (3 years)
- d) B.Sc. Medical Lab Technology Honours (4 years) or B.Sc. Major in Medical Lab Technology (3 years)
- e) B.C.A. Honours (4 years) or B.C.A. Major in Computer Applications (3 years)
- f) B.B.A. Honours (4 years) or B.B.A. Major in Management (3 years)
- g) B.M.S. Gurdwara Management Honours (4 years) or B.M.S. Major in Gurdwara Management (3 years)
- h) B.Com. Honours (4 years) or B.Com. Major in Commerce (3 years)
- i) B.A. Economics Honours (4 years) or B.A. Major in Economics (3 years)
- j) B.A. English Honours (4 years) or B.A. Major in English (3 years)
- k) B.A. Gurmukhi Education Honours (4 years) or B.A. Major in Gurmukhi Education (3 years)
- l) B.P.E.S. Honours (4 years) or B.P.E.S. Major in Physical Education (3 years)

The student can choose any minor along with the major subject options mentioned above.

The scheme and credit structure mentioned in Appendix I shall apply to the above mentioned programmes.

(ii) Multidisciplinary UG Programmes: The university shall offer the following multidisciplinary programmes as honours/major course options:

- a) B.Sc. Medical Honours/Life sciences Honours (4 years) or B.Sc. Major in Life Sciences (3 years)
- b) B.Sc. Non-Medical Honours/Physical Sciences Honours (4 years) or B.Sc. Major in Non-Medical/ Major in Physical Sciences (3 years)
- c) B.A. Social Science/Humanities Honours (4 years) or B.A. Major in Social Sciences/Humanities (3 years)

The scheme and credit structure mentioned in Appendix II shall apply to the above mentioned programmes.

iii) UG Degree Programmes with Double Major: A student has to secure credits from the second major discipline for the 3-year/4-year UG degree to be awarded a double major As per Appendix III. The scheme and credit structure mentioned in Appendix III shall apply to the above mentioned programmes.

iv) List of courses and other details:

- a) Multidisciplinary Courses (MD):** Any subject/s to student's choice which is of

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interdisciplinary nature from faculties rather than major, with the condition that the subject opted for shall not be repeated in any semester. The university shall run the following multidisciplinary courses from the session 2023-24:

b) **Ability Enhancement Course (AE):** It may be modern Indian language (MIL): Punjabi, English language (general), communication skill, or mathematical ability. The university shall run the following courses from the session 2023-24:

- 5) Basic Data Analytical Skills
- 6) Academic Writing Skills

c) **Skill Enhancement Course (SE):** The courses shall be chosen from the list of courses from NSQF as notified by the Sri Guru Granth Sahib World University, Fatehgarh Sahib. The university departments/respective board of studies can propose new courses in addition to NSQF. The university shall run the following courses from the session 2023-24:

- 1) Soft Skills and Personality Development
- 2) Computer Skills
- 3) Entrepreneurial Skills
- 4) Basic Pedagogical Skills
- 5) Intellectual Property Rights
- 6) Sikh Martial Arts (Gatka)
- 7) Basic Course of Music
- 8) Beekeeping
- 9) Bakery and Confectionary Products

d) **Value Added Courses (VA):** The course of Environment Studies (4 credit) will be compulsory for all under graduate programmes and student can choose any two courses (2 Credit) from the following list:

- 1) Ethics and Values
- 2) Physical and Mental Well-being
- 3) Community Engagement
- 4) Life Skill education
- 5) National Service Scheme (NSS)
- 6) Body Posture and Ergonomics
- 7) Disaster Management
- 8) Science of Indian Kitchen

e) **Summer Internship:** It shall be a short-term internship of minimum duration of 15 days mentioned in the credit scheme for a job/professional training in a suitable organization or hands on training or activity-based course at university level in order to gain work experience. The internship shall be under the university teacher who will be designated as Internship Co-ordinator. After completion of summer internship students will have to produce a report and certificate related to the work carried out.

f) **Research project/Dissertation:** Project work is considered a unique course



involving applying the knowledge in solving/analysing/exploring a real-life situation/complex problem/data analysis. Project work has the intention to provide research competencies at the undergraduate level. It enables the acquisition of special/ advanced knowledge through support study/a project work. This course is applicable to students in last year of undergraduate research programs. A separate guideline shall be issued with regard to the evaluation of the Research project/Dissertation.



10. Nomenclature of the courses

11. SUBJECTS OFFERING

- i. A candidate shall have to opt the subjects prescribed as per course framework mentioned in the Appendix from the academic session 2023-24 for four years under graduate programmes.
- ii. A major course can be chosen as any subject from any discipline mentioned above. A minor course opted by the student shall be from any discipline subject to availability of course in the university.
- iii. Student/s can swap between minor and major at the start of 3rd semester only if vacancy/s are available after following procedure laid down for the purpose.

12. AUTHORITY FOR PRESCRIPTION OF COURSES OF STUDIES

The syllabi, reading list, and courses of study for each subject shall be prescribed by the academic council on the recommendation of the respective board of studies.

13. MODIFICATIONS TO THE REGULATIONS

Notwithstanding the foregoing, any amendments /modifications issued or notified by the university grants commission/ higher education commission of India and its verticals or the state government, from time to time, shall have to be passed/approved by the competent authorities of the university.

14. SCHEME OF EXAMINATION

Each theory course/practical course shall be comprised of two assessment tests (Two minor tests carrying 25 marks each) and end-semester examination (Major test of 50 marks). A course consisting of theory and practical component both shall also be comprised of Two assessment tests (Two minor tests carrying 25 marks each) and end-semester examination (Major test of 50 marks) for theory portion, then the obtained marks shall be proportioned to 70 marks by multiplying by 0.7 and end semester practical examination (30 marks). The pattern of Minor and Major tests is given in Appendix IV. The responsibility of conduct and evaluation of the assessment tests and end semester examinations lies with the concerned department as per the University Academic Calendar. All the rules and regulations of the university regarding the examination, conduct of examination shall be applied as such and can be amended from time to time.

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15. AUTHORITY TO INTERPRET STATUTES

With a view to remove any difficulty arising out of the application and implementation of these statutes, the Syndicate of the university shall be competent to give final interpretation of these statutes which shall be final and binding on all the concerned.




